Con Ed Smart Meter Program In Long Island City

**Three Years After Blackout, Con Ed Will Install
Technology Gioia Has Long Advocated**

New York- Councilman Eric Gioia (D-Queens), who has repeatedly called for Con Ed to upgrade its infrastructure with technologies like the smart grid and smart meters, released the following statement today upon receiving the news that Con Ed will begin a smart meter program in Long Island City: "The 2006 blackout showed that Con Ed's infrastructure was totally inadequate for the 21st Century, leaving residents to wonder if the lights will go off whenever the temperature creeps up. We need an investment in new technology that can help prevent blackouts and make the system greener and more energy efficient — just as cities like Boulder and Austin have already done. New Yorkers were long overdue for an upgrade, and it's right that Con Ed start this program in Long Island City."

Gioia has long advocated for Con Ed to upgrade its grid and adopt the latest technologies- one of which is

Smart Meter technology. The Smart Meter is part of the larger "Smart Grid," system, which fully digitizes the power grid by expanding the communication between the consumer, the regulator, and the power plants. By having the three principals in constant digital communication, utilities better regulate the power their stations put out based on need. The Smart Grid harnesses the latest in information technology, while also helping to green the environment.

According to a year-long study by the U.S. Department of Energy's Pacific Northwest National Laboratory, consumers in the Smart Meter system saved 10% on their power bills, and cut their power use by 15% during peak hours. Participants in the study were given electronic meters which got signals from their utility company when power prices were high, along with computer software which helped them Remotely change their power usage.

Candidate 'David' Defeats 'Goliath's' Objections in Board of Elections Commissioners' Hearing



David Rosasco, Conservative Democratic candidate for the 26th District City Council seat in Western Queens, represented by Attorney Stephen H. Weiner, Esq. rehabilitated petitions at a meeting of the Commissioners of the Board of Elections held on Tuesday, August 4 at the Board of Elections Headquarters in Manhattan and defeated a frivolous challenge to his petitions. The Commissioners found that David had more than the required minimum 900 valid signatures, thus certifying his candidacy for the upcoming primary elections scheduled for September 15. The Board's findings uphold democracy, ballot access and voter choice.

Deirdre Feerick, the Democratic Party's endorsed candidate, had filed specific objections (through Ms. Feerick's Co-District Leader, John Smyth) against David Rosasco as the only Conservative Democrat in the race. Approximately 1,700 individuals signed petitions for his candidacy.

David now calls on Ms. Feerick to withdraw her 'Petition to Invalidate' the Board of Elections findings as filed in the New York State Supreme Court for a hearing scheduled for next Tuesday, August 11, and allow for a fair up-and-down vote to take place by the voters and not lawyers.

"The fact that the City Clerk and the Commissioners of the Board of Elections validated my petitions and ruled in favor of rehabilitating my signatures reconfirms that any further legal maneuvers by the objectors would violate the voters' rights to have candidates of their choice on the ballot, and would serve only to disrupt the election process. No further good can come from a courtroom proceeding where potentially 1,700 of our citizens, neighbors and residents of the 26th Councilmanic District who signed my petitions would be forced to testify in a courtroom that they actually signed my petitions: people of all races, colors, backgrounds and religions. It is ludicrous for any Democrat to preach voter access than turn around and deny it to our own.

A disruption of the lives of 1,700 people through a subpoena to appear in court would be to the benefit of no one, particularly the objectors, and would do serious, enduring damage to our community's faith in our system and fair play. 1,700 of our brothers and sisters shall not be humiliated and treated like common criminals for exercising their rights to sign petitions, so it is time for the objectors to pull away from the abyss and allow the election to proceed in the ballot box."

Eric Gioia Chooses Deidre Feerick to Succeed Him as Council Member



Aug. 6-Democratic City Council candidate Deirdre Feerick has received the endorsement of Council Member Eric Gioia, whom Feerick hopes to succeed, in the Democratic primary election on September 15. Gioia, the 26th District's current council member, who is mounting a citywide run for Public Advocate, said Feerick is the candidate most clearly qualified and prepared to take his seat in the City Council and continue to advocate for the district, comprising Sunnyside, Woodside, Hunters Point, Dutch Kills, Long Island City and parts of Maspeth and Astoria.

In announcing his endorsement, Gioia said: "Deirdre Feerick grew up in this neighborhood and she cares passionately about making it a better place. She's dedicated herself to public service and I know that as a City Council Member, she'll continue to fight for affordable housing, good jobs, and opportunities for youth. There are a number of good candidates in this race, but Deirdre Feerick stands out because of her compassion, commitment, and experience. No one will work harder."

Feerick said, "I am honored and humbled that Eric Gioia, a man whose leadership qualities

and commitment to public service I deeply respect, has endorsed me in this race. Like Eric, I was born and raised here and live in this district. It is a special place and I am committed to representing the needs of its neighborhoods as diligently as did Eric. His support is a huge boost because he is respected by voters who value a leader who gets results that matter."

Feerick's community-driven campaign has gained significant momentum, including the endorsements of the Queens County Democratic Party, Queens Borough President Helen Marshall, Congressman Joseph Crowley, Former Council Member Walter McCaffrey, the United Federation of Teachers, the United Food and Commercial Workers (UFCW) Local 1500, he Retail, Wholesale, and Department Store Union (RWDSU) Local 338, and Local 3 of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers.

Feerick, an attorney who has served as a legislative director on the City Council, is a graduate of the State University of New York and Brooklyn Law School. The eldest of six sisters, Feerick's mother is a nurse and her late father was a New York Police Department detective and teamster.

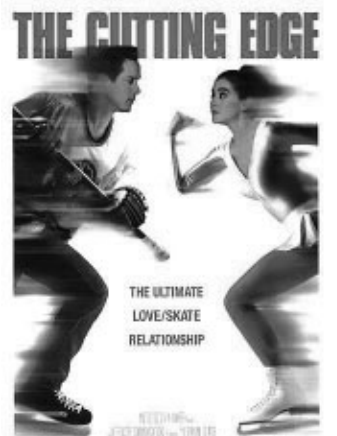

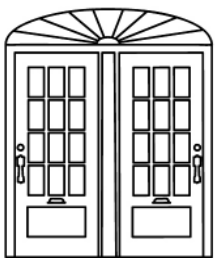

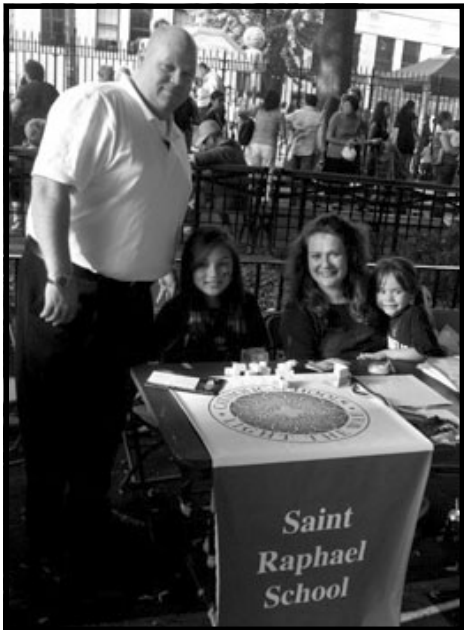

BORDEN AVENUE BRIDGE

The Borden Avenue Bridge recently celebrated its 100th anniversary in 2008. As of January 1, 2009 it has been closed for emergency repairs. The current bridge was opened on March 25th, 1908 at a cost of \$157,606. It crosses over the Dutch Kills of Newtown Creek. It averages about 16,000 in daily traffic. The western abutment shifted, disturbing the bridges alignment. It is one of four bridges in the nation that is retractable and opens horizontally on wheels. Businesses near the bridge say (NY Times).

The D.O.T. estimates the cost to stabilize the abutment at \$14,000,000 a far cry from the original \$157,000. The Department of Transportation has identified a pocket of contaminated soil as "non hazardous." It poses no significant health risk to workers or the surrounding community. Precautionary measures will be taken to remove and dispose of the contamination. A Corrective Action Plan (CAP) has been submitted to the New York State DEC for review and approval. A date for the work to be done precludes an accurate prediction for an anticipated completion date, although, every effort will be made to complete the project in the spring of 2010. 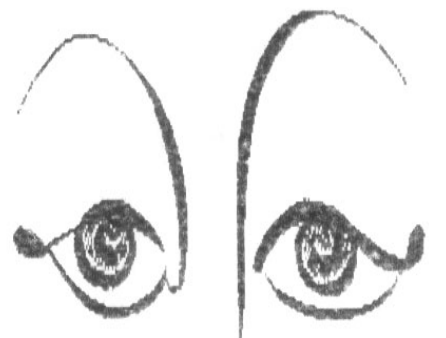

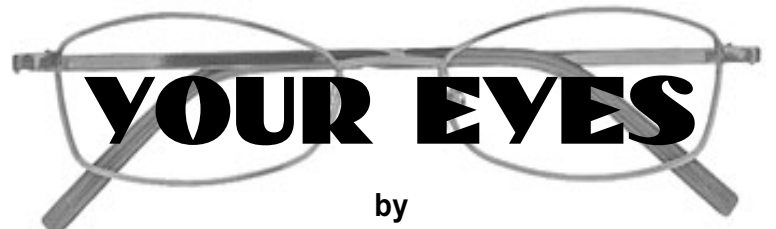

**WHY EARLY
CHILD EYE EXAM?**

If your child has a vision problem, even if it is not noticeable now, it may be critical to have it corrected before the child enters school. That's the one reason why eye doctors recommend that every child's eyes be examined by the time he or she is three years old.

A common problem of early childhood is strabismus of crossed eyes. There are many variations of this condition, but essentially it means that the child's eyes are not perfectly parallel when viewing an object. This problem is not always obvious, but any degree of strabismus may cause permanent vision problems if left uncorrected. The child must learn to use both eyes together in viewing objects in order to see them three-dimensionally. Otherwise the child will never have normal depth perception.

If your child hasn't had his or her eyes examined or if you are concerned about possible vision problems, make an appointment with your eye doctor for an examination.
